| # Question Type | Sentence/Phrase | Correction/Answer |
|------------------------|--|---|
| 21 Order | a (small, old, beautiful) vase | a beautiful, small, old vase (Opinion, Size, Age) |
| 22 Order | a (red, huge, wooden, German) dog kennel | a huge, red, German, wooden dog kennel (Size, Color, Origin, Material) |
| 23 Error Correction | That is the most unique piece of art I've ever seen. | That is a truly unique piece of art I've ever seen. (or unique - 'most unique' is a double superlative error with an absolute adj.) |
| 24 Error Correction | The concert sounded greatly. | The concert sounded great. (linking verb 'sounded' requires an adjective, not an adverb) |
| 25 Error Correction | This problem is more easier than the last one. | This problem is easier than the last one. (double comparative error) |
