Rules Reminder:
May: Used to express a possibility or permission. It suggests a slightly higher chance than "might."
Might: Used to express a possibility. It suggests a slightly lower chance than "may."
 Could: Used to express a past possibility or a present/future possibility. It is also used to express ability in the past.
